

Verb -ing or (to) Infinitive

GRAMMAR

The infinitive is used after modal verbs

I should quit this job

The to infinitive is used after ...

- semi modals (I have to run to the toilet)
- Certain verbs (I attempted to convince my boss for a raise but was unsuccessful)
- Certain verbs + object (You can't force people to like rugby no matter how hard you try.)

Verb -ing is used...

- Some **verbs** which express **dis/likes** (I loathe eating Russian salad).
- But note these exceptions; love/hate/like/prefer are usually by verb -ing but can be filled by to infinitive.
- Would + love/hate/like/prefer is always filled by the to infinitive (I would hate to get up early everyday)
- Certain verbs (The Prime Minister finally finished talking after an hour and forty-five minutes of harping on..)

A small number of verbs can be followed by both..

• With no change in meaning (I've just started to learn/learning to be a full stacker)

NOTE: with verbs like/love/hate there is a slight change in meaning

- I like to go to the gym every week. (the focus is on the result)
- I like going to the gym every week. (The focus is on the action itself)

Verbs expressing perception

- I saw the plane land. (I saw the whole action)
- I saw the plane landing. (I saw part of the action)

Forget

- I forgot to do my work.(I didn't do it)
- I forgot doing my work.(I did it but I don't remember)

Remember



- I remember logging out yesterday.(I am recalling something)
- I remember to log out every day. (I have to do and I do it)

Regret

- I regret telling Claudio he couldn't eat junk food.(I wish i hadn't told him because he got angry)
- I regret to tell you Claudio you can't eat junk food anymore(I am sorry i had to tell him the unwelcome news)
